CONGRATULATIONS TO NCW ILLUSTRATED POEM CONTEST WINNERS

As part of NCW 2020, nation-wide 800 students from grades K-12 shared their interpretation of the theme, "Sticking with Chemistry", in the form of illustrated poems. SoFL-ACS received 160 entries. The following four illustrated poems won first place in the local competition and received an award certificate and \$25 gift card. Their poems were entered in the national ACS competition.

K-2 category – Aidany Diaz, 2nd grade at Miami Gardens Elementary, and her teacher Ms. Maritza Salazar

- 3-5 category Luke Evans, 5th grade at Howard Drive Elementary, and his teacher, Ms. Julie Yngber
- 6-8 category Audrey DellaVecchia, 6th grade at Wellington Landings Middle School, and her teacher, Ms. Theresa Cameron

9-12 category - Melanie Montero, 9th grade at Somerset Academy Silver Palms, and her teacher, Mrs. Nelia Ferrufino

At the national level, first- and second-place prizes were awarded in each of the four categories. Two of the SoFL-ACS entries won first and second place, respectively, in the national ACS competition.

SoFL-ACS Bylaws Revisions

National ACS requires local sections to update their bylaws every few years to bring them into compliance with the national ACS constitution and bylaws. The SoFL-ACS bylaws were last updated in 2015. Consequently, the Executive Committee has approved minor updates in wording and two substantive changes to our bylaws: 1) Addition of the *Younger Chemists* (YCC) committee to the list of standing committees. 2) The terms of office of the Secretary and the Treasurer *shall be for two* (2) *years beginning on alternating years*.
