

### Dr. Mary Ann Jungbauer, 1934-2013



Dr. Mary Ann Jungbauer, 78, Professor Emerita at Barry University, Miami Shores, passed away on July 30, 2013 in Miami. Born and raised in Phoenix, AZ, she was a member of the Sisters of the Immaculate Heart from 1954 to 1967, during which time she earned a B.A. in chemistry from Immaculate Heart College, Los Angeles, in 1957, and Ph.D. in inorganic and physical chemistry from Notre Dame University in 1964. She left the convent to pursue a career in chemical education, which spanned over 40 years, ranging from high school chemistry and physics teacher in the Los Angeles

Archdiocesan schools (1956-59), Lecturer at Mount Saint Mary's College, Los Angeles (1965-67), Assistant Professor of Chemistry at Immaculate Heart College, Los Angeles (1963-67), Assistant Professor of Chemistry at Drew University, Madison, NJ (1967-69). There she met and married a fellow chemist, had a son and moved to Miami as Associate and later full Professor of Chemistry at Barry University (1969-1998) where she was Chair of the Department of Physical Sciences, 1980-1994. She was an emeritus member of ACS, and on the occasion of her 50th year of ACS membership in 2010 she was honored by the South Florida Section with a Salute to Excellence for her lifelong devotion to chemical education and service to ACS. She served as chair of the ACS Florida Section in 1983, Chair-Elect (1981-82), and chair of Miami Subsection of the Florida Section in 1980 (chair-elect 1979). She is survived by son Richard Richards (Tamara), grandchildren Penny and Zachary Richards, sister Rosa Lee Walsh, and several nieces and nephews. Condolences to her family from the South Florida Section.

## Dr. Cyril Párkányi, 1933-2013

Dr. Cyril Parkanyi, 79, Chair of the Department of Chemistry and Biochemistry, Florida Atlantic University, died on April 26, 2013. Cyril received his BS (1954) and MS (1956; honors) from Charles University, Prague, Czech Republic and his PhD from the Czech Academy of Sciences, Prague in 1962. He started his career as a physical and analytical chemist at the Research and Control Institute of Food Industry in Prague (1955-1956). He then worked at the Institute of Physical Chemistry, Czech Academy of Sciences, Prague eventually as a Senior Research Scientist (1960-68). He joined the University of Texas at El Paso in 1969 eventually becoming Professor of Chemistry and from 1982-1988 Chair. In 1989 he joined Florida Atlantic University as Professor and Chair



(1989-1994 and Interim Chair 2010 to his death). He was instrumental in establishing the PhD program at FAU. He worked extensively with scientists around the world and held visiting scientists positions at the Rijksuniversiteit te Leiden and Rijksuniversiseit te Groningen, Netherlands; California Institute of Technology; Universite d'Aix-Marseille III, France; University of Kuwait, Kuwait; Universite Paris, France; and Universitat Ulm, Germany. Among the awards he received were the Research Award of the Czech Academy of Sciences, the Medal of the University of Qatar, the Medal of the University of Cairo and the FAU Professorial Excellence Award. His research interests included physical and theoretical organic chemistry, heterocyclic chemistry, organic synthesis, food chemistry, environmental chemistry, and coordination chemistry with over 200 publications and numerous book chapters. He served on various editorial boards including Journal of Heterocyclic Chemistry, Arkivoc, Organic Chemistry International and Green and Sustainable Chemistry. He was a gentle but efficient administrator and fellow scientist. He enjoyed traveling, orchids, classical music and life as a professor. He is survived by wife, Marie; son, Michael; and his sisters, Marika and Vera. A *Celebration of Life "High Tea"* to honor and remember his life will be held:
